Literature Reviews



- Literature reviews and reviewing the literature
- Widen the context
- Consolidate evidence to inform policy and practice

| Туре | Aim | Used For | What's Included? |
|---------------------------|--|---|---|
| Scoping | Describe breadth of literature, without assessing quality | When little is known about a topic | Any type of publication |
| Systematic | Rigorous synthesis to answer a specific practice question | Informing clinical practice | Quantitative research |
| Rapid | Faster evidence synthesis | Dealing with emergent issues | Quantitative studies, practice guidelines |
| Meta- Ethnography | Consolidate qualitative findings on a topic | Sharing what is known about an experience/culture | Qualitative research |
| Meta-Narrative or Realist | Assess broad ideas or mechanisms behind a phenomenon | How we got to be this way/ what is happening here | Varies- usually most publications |
| Integrative | Summarizes literature to provide a comprehensive understanding | What do we know about a phenomenon | Research and non- research publications |

Systematic Reviews



- Exhaustive effort to produce definitive practice answers
- Often used to create practice guidelines or decision aids



Trusted evidence.
Informed decisions.
Better health.





| Туре | Aim | Used For |
|--------------------------------------|-----------------------|--|
| Meta-analysis | Statistical synthesis | Combine results of quantitative trials that all answer the same question |
| Meta-synthesis (or meta-aggregation) | Thematic synthesis | Combine the themes of qualitative studies that address the same topic |
